

## BAEd Secondary Design and Technology Regulations

### 1. General

1.1 The University grants a BAEd Degree. Holders of this Degree may, subject to satisfying all other necessary conditions, be recommended for qualified teacher status to the Secretary of State for the Department for Education and Employment .

### 2. Conditions of Admission to the Degree

2.1 In order to be admitted to the Degree of BAEd a candidate must:

2.1.1 satisfy the entry requirements specified by the DfEE and the University. Details may be obtained from the University Entrance Requirements Officer;

2.1.2 be admitted to and complete to the satisfaction of the examiners the course of study leading to the Preliminary Course, Part 1, Part 11 and Part 111 examinations as prescribed in these regulations;

2.1.3 have been examined in all parts of the examination prescribed for the Preliminary Course, Part 1, Part 11 and Part 111 and have shown a competent knowledge in the examinations for the degree as a whole, including satisfying the examiners in Professional Practice and School Experience.

### 3 Period of Study

3.1 The period of study extends over a minimum of four academic year of full time study.

### 4 Course of Study

4.1 The course of study will be as follows:

\* School experience in each year will be specified by the school-college Partnership programme and will consist of a total of not less than 32 weeks in conformance with DfEE requirements.

## 5. Scheme of Examination

### 5.1 The Scheme of Examination will be as follows:

The Preliminary Course examination will take place after the completion of one year of study and will comprise the following elements:

- i) School experience (DS51008A)
- ii) Professional Practice Report (2,500 words) (DS51003A)
- iii) Curriculum Resource Materials (2,500 words equivalent) (DS51004A)
- iv) Design Practice (Exhibition of design project work) (DS51005A)
- vi) Design in Society (2,500 word essay) (DS51006A)
- v) Design Technology (2hr. paper) (DS51007A)

All Preliminary Course elements are Pass/Fail.

The Part I examination will be taken after the completion of two years of study and will comprise the following elements:

- i) School Experience (Pass/Fail) (DS52009A)
- ii) Education Studies Reports (4,000 words including seminar presentations) (DS52007A)
- iii) Curriculum Resource Materials (4000 words equivalent) (DS52008A)
- iv) Design Practice (Exhibition of design project work) (DS52004A)
- vi) Design in Society (5,000 word essay) (DS52005A)
- v) Design Technology (3hr paper) (DS52006A)

The Part II examination will be taken after the completion of three years of study and will comprise the following elements:

- i) School Experience (Pass/Fail) (DS53008A)
- ii) Education Studies Reports (5,000 words including seminar presentations) (DS53005A)
- iii) Curriculum Resource Materials (5000 words equivalent) (DS53009A)
- iv) Design Practice (Exhibition of design project work) (DS53010A)
- v) Further Technology (3 hr paper): (DS53006A)
- vi) Design Innovation (1 minor and 1 major report totalling 4,000 words) (DS530011A)

The Part III examination will be taken after the completion of four years of study and will comprise the following elements:

- i) School Experience (Pass/Fail) (DS54009A)
- i) Prof.Practice Report (10,000 words + seminar presentation) (DS54010A)
- iii) Design Practice (Exhibition of design project work) (DS54011A)

5.2 A candidate must satisfy the examiners in the Preliminary Course examination before proceeding to the course of study leading to the examination for Part I and in Part I of the examination before proceeding to the course of study leading to Part II and in Part II of the examination before proceeding to the course of study leading to Part III, subject to the exemptions stated in paragraphs 5.5 and 5.6m below.

5.3 A candidate will not be permitted to proceed to the course of study in Year 2 or Year 3 or Year 4 unless the College has certified that in the previous year s/he has reached a satisfactory standard in School Experience.

5.4 Except as is provided in paragraphs 5.5 and 5.6 below, a candidate who fails to satisfy the examiners in the Preliminary Course, Part I, Part II or Part III examination will be required on re-entry to that Part to take all elements specified in the Regulations for that Part.

5.5 Except as is provided in paragraph 5.3 above, and at the discretion of the Board of Examiners, a candidate who achieves a satisfactory standard in all but one element of the Part I and/or of the Part II examination may be credited with the elements in which s/he has passed and may be referred in the one element in which s/he has failed. If the candidate does not satisfy the examiners in the referred element taken alone at the next succeeding Part I or Part II examination s/he will be credited with the whole of the Part I or Part II examination. At the discretion of the Board of Examiners the re-entry for the referred Part I element may be made either with or in advance of the Part II examination and the re-entry for the referred Part II element may be made either with or in advance of the Part III examination. If a candidate who re-enters for a referred Part I element at the same time as s/he enters for Part II passed Part II but again fails in the referred element s/he may be credited with Part II but may not proceed to Part III unless s/he satisfies the examiners in that element at the next succeeding Part I examination. If a candidate who re-enters for a referred Part II element at the same time as s/he enters for Part III passes in Part III but again fails in the referred element s/he may be credited with Part III but the Degree will not be conferred upon the candidate unless s/he satisfies the examiners in that element at the next succeeding Part II examination.

At the discretion of the Board of Examiners a candidate who achieves a satisfactory standard in all but one element of the Part III examination may be referred in that one element and permitted to re-enter in that element alone on one occasion only. If on that re-entry s/he fails to reach the prescribed standard in the referred element s/he will, on any subsequent re-entry, be required to take all the elements prescribed for the Part III examination.

8. Classification for Honours

8.1 The Classification for Honours will be based on the candidate's performance in the Part I Part II and Part III examinations. School Experience will not be taken into account in assessment for Honours.

8.2 Successful candidates for the BAEd Degree will be awarded either (a) First Class Honours, or (b) Second Class Honours, or (c) Third Class Honours, or (d) Pass.

The Second Class Honours list will be divided into an Upper and a Lower Division. The names will be in alphabetical order for each Class or Division.

- vi) Design Innovation (1 minor and 1 major report totalling 4,000 words) (DS530011A) 0.75
