Starters Menu

In this area, write a list of 5-10 homework ideas for a key stage, project or year group. The set of homework listed here should be achievable and based on prior knowledge.

Add success-criteria; a simple statement describing how each homework will be assessed and what is needed.

Make sure each-homework can literally be read there and then, and is a 'Takeaway'. This means, it requires no further guidance.

It may be that you design this template so that it folds 3-ways on both sides; providing 6 possible spaces that you could add information. Remember to keep it simple!

Assessment / Reward Criteria:

This area should include marking and assessment. How will each piece of homework be assessed? This could be displayed with a grading/marking code alongside each homework statement. An indication of timeframe / time-expected, website links and possible rewards.

Main Dish Menu

In this area, write a list of 5-10 homework ideas. The set of homework listed here should be achievable – with effort.

Students will be required to complete additional work, regardless of what has / has not taken place in the classroom. **For example;**

1. Write 2 paragraphs explaining who Henry VIII was. Tell the teacher something you didn't know.
2. Create a mind-map of everything you know about Henry VIII. 
3. Write and perform a poem about the life of Henry VIII.  
4. Design a multiple-choice quiz about Henry VIII for other students to attempt in class. 
5. Design a poster about the life of Henry VIII. 

Buffet Menu:

This area should include a range of possibilities for students to complete. Either listing a sequence of multiple choice/selection of homework to be attempted over time. This could be indicated with star icons to show 'star choices.'



Desserts Menu

In this area, write a list of 5-10 homework ideas. The set of homework listed here should be a difficult to achieve, but also enticing to try.

Students will be required to complete a great deal of hard work outside of the classroom. Struggle should be expected, but the rewards should be high.

Menu-o-meter:

This area should include a range of possibilities for students to complete. Either listing a sequence of multiple choice/selection of homework to be attempted over time. E.g. clock = time; chilli = hard; pepper = differentiated
